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



















Project and Partners

BESTbelt – More power for the European Green Belt



The EU-funded BESTbelt project, part of the European Green Belt Initiative, aims to enhance biodiversity conservation across 24 countries. Launched in 2021, it empowers civil society organizations with small grants to protect biodiversity, restore nature, raise environmental awareness, strengthen communities, and create green jobs until the project's end in 2026. With 49 projects in 21 countries involving around 80 organizations, BESTbelt promotes cross-border collaboration to turn the vision of safeguarding Europe's longest green network into reality.















Organisation and Implementation of Projects at the European Green Belt



Questions for organising a project:

- Which projects are implemented currently?
- Which activities/ one main task or diverse programs?
- Target groups? Where to recruit participants?
- Organisational support, e.g. by organisations facilitating volunteers to organisations?
- Transborder or international?
- Which funds do you use?
- Is the exchange long term?

Our implementation (BUND/ BUNDjugend):

- Independent organisation, partly in cooperation with existing partners and regional stakeholders
- Funding through existing project funds (european, federal and state funding)
- Participation is free for all participants
- Implementation carried out independently by project staff and existing partners





First break-out session: event formats and requirements

Target groups, recruitment of participants



- Potential target groups: school classes, student (group)s, local/international volunteers, mixed groups (international young groups, mixed age, locals and internationals...)
- Recruitment of participants: In the region, within the EGB network, on (European)
 platforms for volunteers
- Recruitment of experts (e.g. historians, orchid specialists, contemporary witnesses
- Accommodation: e.g. vacation camps or apartments, outdoor wilderness camps...
- Potential funds: e.g. Bestbelt, Erasmus, national or local funds, foundations
- Singular event or long term exchange: e.g. annual camp or training
- Networks (local, crossborder, international, interdisciplinary)
- Certification for educational leave possible

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Topics and Activities at the European Green Belt



Content and Activities J

- History of the Iron Curtain from the Second World War until 1989, encompassing the two military power blocs and social and economic systems
- Personal Stories (experiences of escape, forced resettlement, life in the restricted zone, or as border guard)
- The development of the Green Belt as posivitve example of transformation (National Natural Monument, Natura 2000)
- The importance of the Green Belt for biodiversity, species protection and habitat connectivity
- Landscape History: explaing geology, cultural landscape, influence on biodiversity and habitats at the Green Belt
- Dependence of species spectrum on Site Conditions
- · Succession versus landscape management
- Borders (personal, visible, invisible borders)

- Excursions, including identification of local animals and plants, and visits to historical remnants of the former border.
- School projects with field trips (e.g., assessing site conditions and habitats, identifying plants and animals, conducting water quality and hydromorphicval structure).
- Green Belt Rallys, featuring environmental games and nature discoveries, e.g. with kindergardens.
- Work camps/ Youth camps with locals and internationals/ Landscape management with volunteers (e.g., scything, clearing bushes, creating animal shelters, land art)
- Youth leader/multiplyer training: multi-day hikes exploring, the Green Belt with expert inputs and contemporary witnesses
- Readings and conversations with contemporary witnesses around the campfire
- Supervision of seminar papers
- Virtual 360 degree tours (e.g. www.360-grad.bund.net/gruenes-band/rhoen) top explore the Green Belt regions digitally


